OUR PARTNER

Founded in 2003, **M'Lop Tapang** is a community-led not-for-profit organisation working with at-risk children, youth, and families in Sihanoukville, Cambodia.

Those served by M'Lop Tapang often live in a situation of acute crisis. M'Lop Tapang's immediate goal is stabilising their situation and ensuring their safety. Once stabilised, M'Lop Tapang helps communities access opportunities for a better future.

THE MODEL

M'Lop Tapang focuses on addressing the causes which force children to:

Drop out of school

Engage in dangerous work

Live in perilous situations

These causes typically involve complex family situations and require solutions like healthcare, education, livelihood support, safe shelter, and protection.

This is why M'Lop Tapang offers diverse direct services and partners with public and private institutions to solve family problems and strengthen the community.

In 2023 alone, M'Lop Tapang **impacted the lives of more than 6,000 vulnerable and at-risk children and youth.** More than 4,000 marginalised families were provided support through their community services.

WHAT YOUR FUNDING COULD UNLOCK

Supports 25 victims of abuse and the management of an **emergency hotline service**

Supports access to **educational** activities for 150 children

Provides temporary safe shelter to about 30 children annually, as well as foster care and independent living placement for about 15 children and youth annually

Supports vocational training for 100 youth and job skills training and connection to safe employment for 500 youth and parents

Provides up to 25,000 medical services to vulnerable children and their communities

THE BACKGROUND

Over the last two decades, rapid commercial development has dramatically transformed Sihanoukville from a sleepy beach town into a bustling hub of activity. Construction projects span the city, attracting migrant workers from rural areas in **search of labour opportunities**. These unskilled, often uneducated workers frequently move to Sihanoukville with their families, hoping for a better future.

However, the conditions for these families are dire, particularly for the children. They face exposure to drug trafficking, organised crime, substance abuse, and the domestic violence that often accompanies these issues. Children in these environments grow up in precarious conditions where basic needs are often unmet. Their physical health is compromised by poor living conditions, and their mental wellbeing is threatened by exposure to violence and instability. There is also a severe lack of access to educational opportunities and safe play areas for children, further limiting their prospects for breaking out of this cycle of poverty and vulnerability.

As Sihanoukville continues its development, addressing these multi-faceted challenges is crucial to creating a more inclusive and sustainable environment for all its residents, ensuring that the city's progress does not leave its most vulnerable behind.

Recent data from UNICEF states that in Cambodia:

40% of the population lives just above the poverty line

Nearly 55%

of students will have dropped out of school by the time they turn 17

32%

of children under five years of age experience stunted growth
